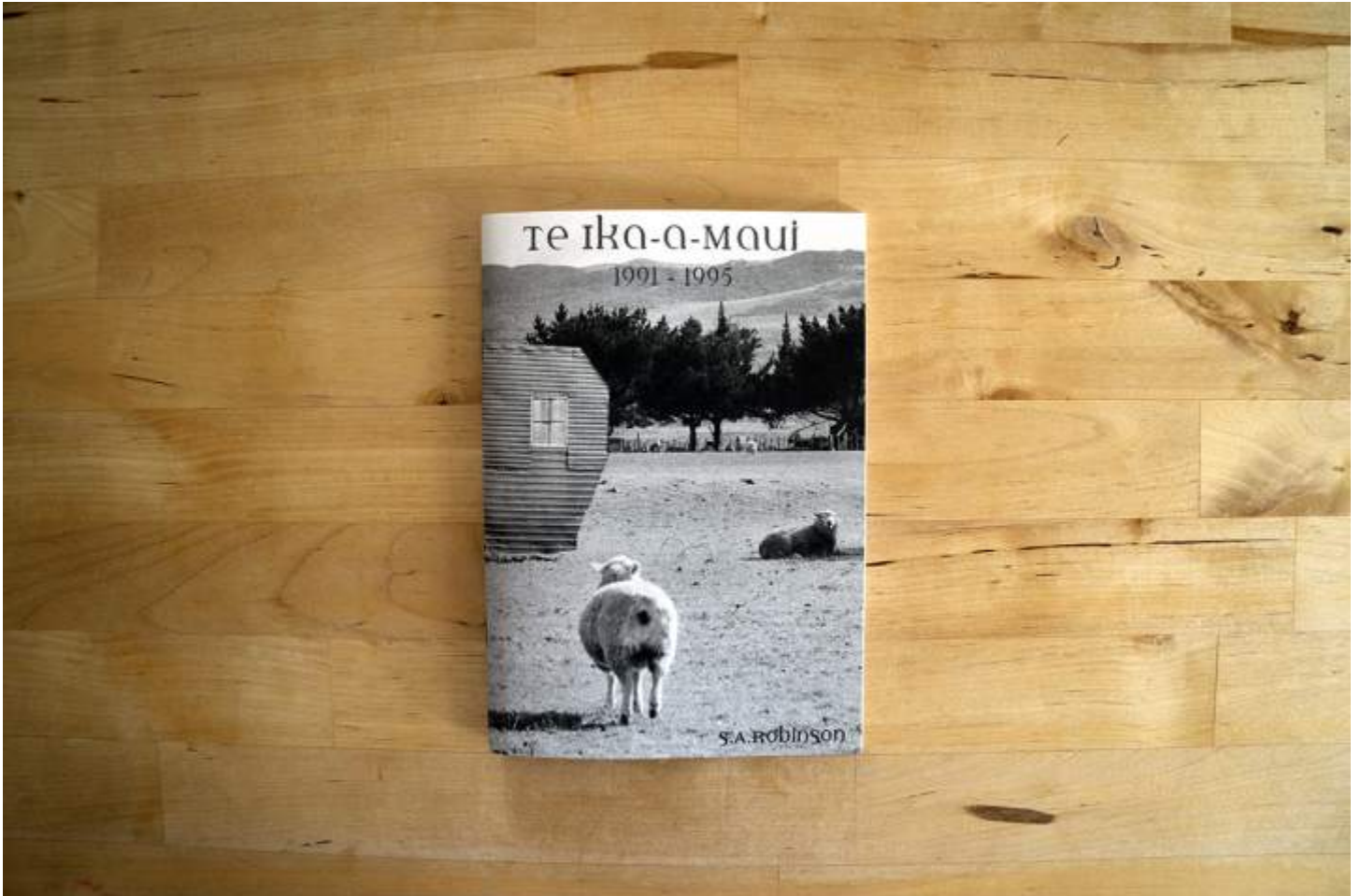
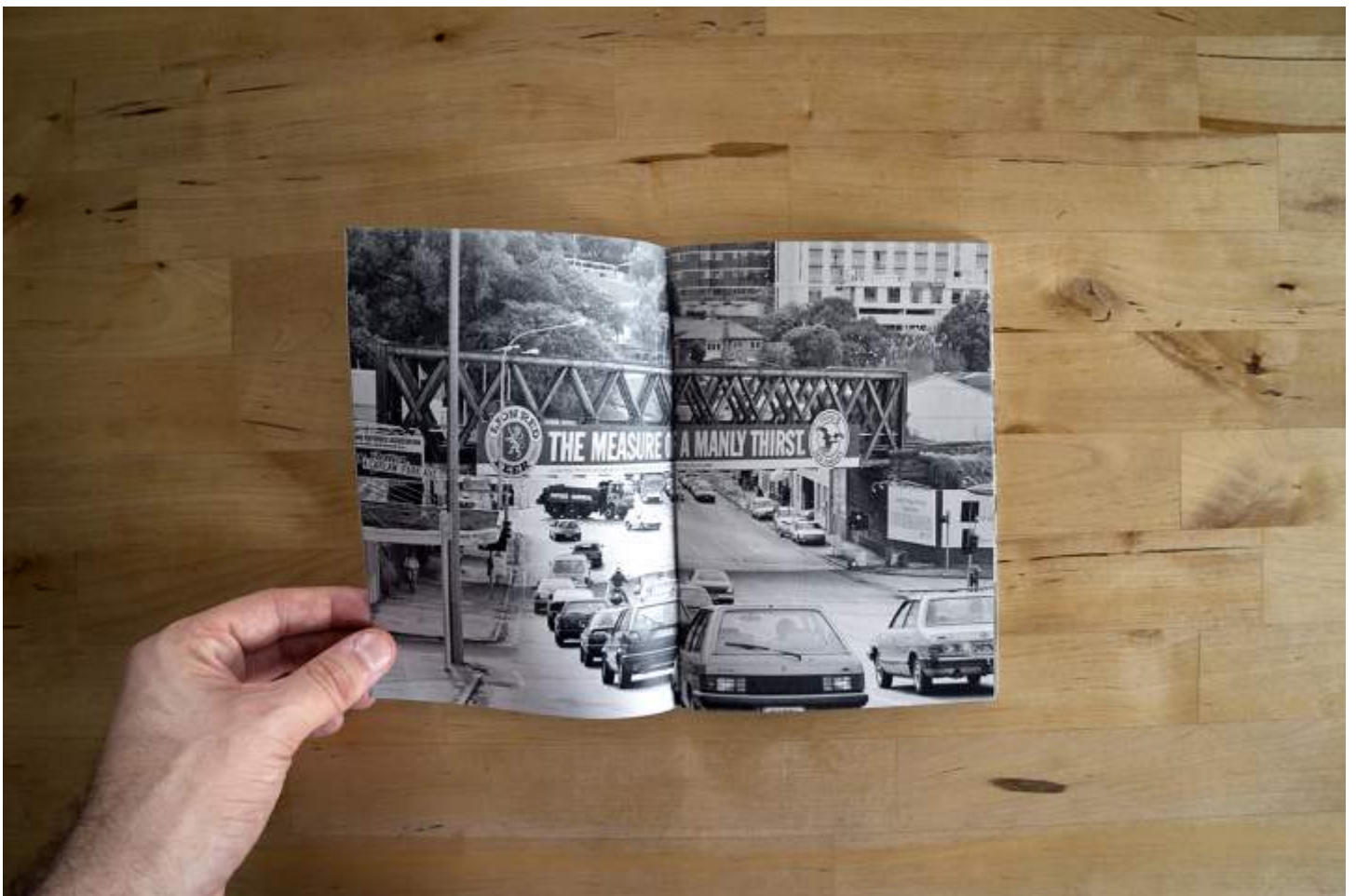

Te Ika-a-Maui 1991-1995 by S.A. Robinson



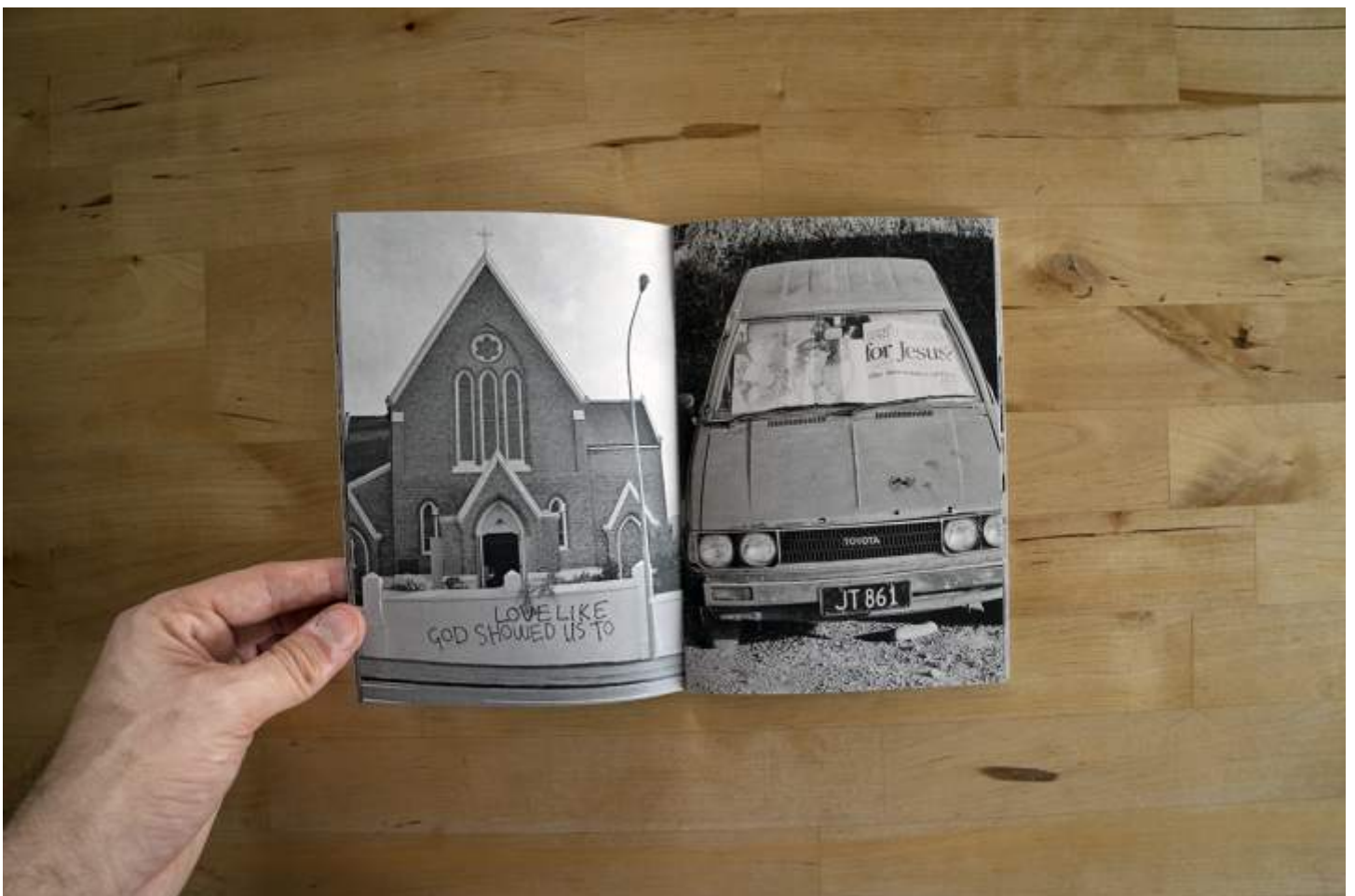

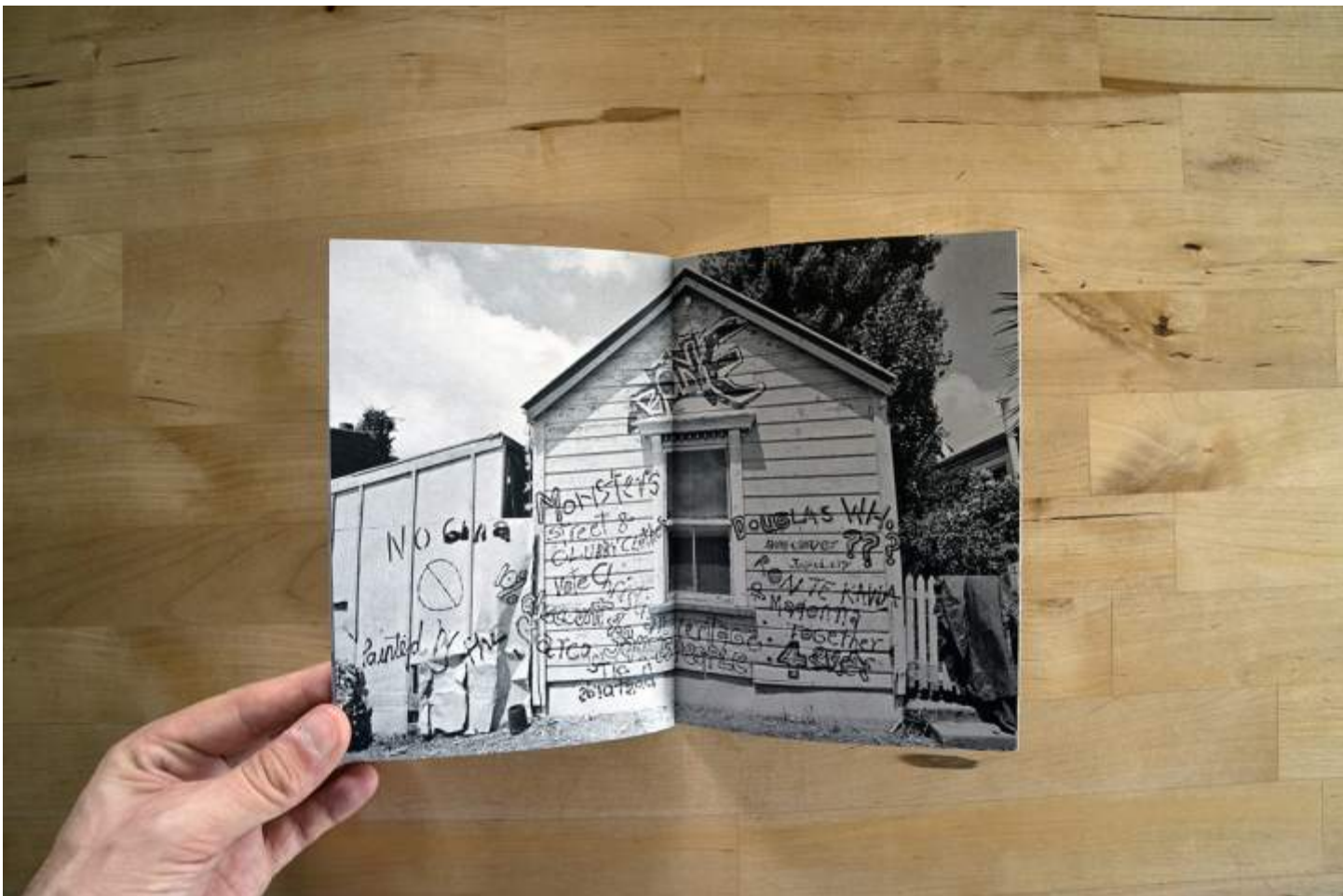
Te ika-a-maui (the fish of maui) is the Maori name for the North Island. And this book gives us a look at what life was like there during the early to mid nineties. The funny thing is, it looks very similar to the UK in the late eighties.



Having lived on the North Island myself, social deprivation is not really an image that you associate with New Zealand, but this story of a land shows us differently. There is a dark, cynical sense of humour that runs through these images.



Showing a land that has struggled with the social implications of suppression of the indigenous population. Interspersed with this are scenes of beauty and community. This little book takes you on a very interesting journey.
